Maryville is a leader in the treatment of substance use and cooccurring disorders. Since 1949, our evidence-based treatment programs have helped bring hope, health, and healing to those suffering from opioid, alcohol, and other substance use disorders.

Our staff devote themselves each day to helping our patients reclaim their lives. Maryville's expert treatment teams bring the specialized expertise necessary for long-term recovery.

Message From the CEO



Dear Friends,

As New Jersey continues to have one of the highest rates of preventable drug-related deaths in the country, Maryville has launched new programs to improve access to treatment and offer a stronger continuum of care. We are proud to announce the implementation of two Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) funded Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHCs) in Gloucester and Cumberland counties. Through our

CCBHCs, we bring together doctors, clinicians, case managers, peers with lived experience of recovery, and the client to create a person centered treatment plan aimed at long term wellness. For example, through our CCBHC holistic care model, a mother recovering from substance use and mental health disorders can also receive peer support to secure housing, vocational training or job placement, and transportation to physical health and other related appointments.

The New Jersey Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) has also entrusted Maryville with a grant to begin an outcomes based program to combat the rise in amphetamine related deaths in New Jersey. Maryville's Contingency Management program combines group and individual therapy with financial incentives and wellness programs to help clients achieve treatment goals. Maryville has also been licensed by the New Jersey Department of Health, Certificate of Need and Facility Licensing to serve adolescents in our Gloucester and Cumberland county sites. Through these new programs, more members of our communities are entering treatment and sustaining recovery.

Our community partnerships are key to our success. Through relationships with our healthcare partners, local officials, law enforcement, faith based organizations and other groups, we have expanded our resources to educate the public and improve the health and well being of those we serve.

Thank you to our volunteer board, staff, and community for your support of the Maryville mission and those we serve.




New Programming

Maryville Obtains Adolescent Outpatient License

After receiving its adolescent outpatient license, Maryville launched substance use and co-occurring mental health services for youth 11-17. Youth receive assessments and treatment, including individual counseling and family counseling in this program. Services are available in-person or via telehealth and transportation is provided.

Nationally, in 2023, 11% of eighth graders, 20% of 10th graders, and 31% of 12th graders reported illicit drug use in the past year.



New Camden County Initiatives

Camden County awarded Maryville funding to hire an additional full-time Certified Peer Recovery Specialist to work across three remaining homeless shelters in Camden County. This funding allows us to offer peer services in five county shelters. Peers provide screening, placement in treatment, and supportive services to aid individuals prior to, during, and post-treatment. Maryville began providing this service with one peer working across two shelters in 2020.

The County of Camden provided us with funding to add a full-time intensive case



manager to our inpatient programs. Intensive Case Managers conduct case management assessments and service planning on an ongoing basis, develop recovery plans in partnership with the client, and coordinate services across multiple health and social service systems based on each individual's unique needs.

Finally, Maryville was awarded a contract by the Camden County Prosecutor's Office to participate in Operation Helping Hand, a monthly community outreach event that offers substance use and mental health screening and supports, along with other social services. Individuals are placed in treatment and connected to a variety of services based on need.

New Programming

New Funding from NJDMHAS

Maryville was awarded NJ Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (NJDMHAS) funding to begin two outpatient programs for specialty populations. Our Turnersville site began services for the LGBTQIA+ population while the Vineland site launched them for Spanish-speaking individuals. The LGBTQIA+ initiative placed 2nd in the NJ Social Innovation Awards for "Innovation for Special Populations."

NJDMHAS also awarded Maryville funds to expand our co-occurring gambling treatment to include our Cumberland County outpatient program. Now individuals with



co-occurring gambling and substance use disorders can receive treatment and support services at our Vineland outpatient site as well as our inpatient programs.

Finally, Maryville received NJDMHAS funds to hire five peer recovery specialists for each level of care in our inpatient treatment programs. Peer recovery specialists are individuals who have lived their own recovery journey and serve as voices of experience for clients in various stages of their recovery. They will serve as coaches, advocates, and support staff for those enrolled in our medically monitored withdrawal (detox), short-term, and long-term residential programs.

I don't know what I would have done without my counselor. She helped me see a life outside of addiction and I am so thankful for her. It's been a roller coaster but she helped me through it. I am so grateful for the last two years and wouldn't be here today if these fabulous people didn't play an amazing role in my recovery. Thank you all so much.

Recovery for Life Gala





On April 21, 2023, Maryville held its 10th Annual Recovery for Life Gala. More than 200 guests came together to honor Sonja Furlow, Esq., Section Chief of the Community Outreach and Engagement Unit (COE Unit) of the Camden County Prosecutor's Office; Melissa O'Mara, Esq., a licensed attorney in the State of New Jersey and Assistant Prosecutor for Burlington County: Michele Schreffler-Perez. and

Intelligence Analyst/Subject Matter Specialist, and Operation RISE Program Directing Officer for the New Jersey State Police Office of Drug Monitoring & Analysis Drug Monitoring Initiative, for their contributions to the field. Each received Maryville's Advocacy in Action award, recognizing their efforts in the field of addiction.

Chris Therien, former professional hockey player, Olympic Silver Medalist, and sports broadcaster, served as the event's guest speaker. Chris shared his personal story of alcohol addiction, resilience, and recovery.

The Recovery for Life Gala raised more than \$130,000 for Maryville's programs in order to provide critical treatment and supports to those with substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders. Proceeds from the Gala supported mental health programming, youth outpatient services, peer recovery supports, and client transport.

Black IV Scholarship Fund at Maryville, which supports those unable to afford treatment. The fund was founded by Kathleen "Kate" Holt in honor of her son Peter, who passed away in 2004 from a substance use disorder.

Dominic Lizzio and Natalie Baker took first place for the top male and female finishers. The event was the most successful race yet, raising more than \$31,000 for the scholarship fund.






Client Impact at Maryville

Transforming Lives with Proven Results

- Maryville served over 9,000 unduplicated individuals through treatment and support services.
- 90% of Maryville clients would recommend us to a friend or family member in need of services.
- 89% of Maryville clients felt they had gained the skills necessary to support their recovery.

Through Peer Recovery Support Services:

- 430 clients were placed in sober living homes.
- 224 clients were able to obtain their social security card, birth certificate, driver's license, or another form of identification.
- 558 clients obtained General Assistance and/or SNAP food benefits.
- 136 clients received employment assistance.
- 65 clients obtained health insurance.
- 116 clients were able to schedule medical appointments.

In our SAMHSA Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC):

- 1,520 individuals were served.
- 280 individuals obtained health insurance.
- 33 adolescents received treatment.

LGBTQIA+ services:

- 95% of clients obtained/maintained stable housing.
- 84% of clients obtained/maintained stable employment.
- 97% of clients did not become involved with the criminal justice system.
